Short Range Weather: A large storm system will be responsible for a period of very active weather across many areas of the lower 48 into the middle of the week. Threats associated with this storm include blizzard conditions across the northern Plains, extremely critical fire weather across the High Plains, and a multi-day severe weather and flooding threat from the Plains into the MS River Valley -NWS

Long Range: There is a trough in the West and a ridge in the East. The trough will send a couple of pieces of energy through the country over the next 10 days, inducing a couple of strong spring storm systems. The trough will shift to the East next week while a ridge temporarily builds back into the West. The U.S. and European models are somewhat similar through with the overall pattern but develop storm systems a bit differently. I will use a blend but favor the European. For the outlook period, temperatures on Saturday will be near to above normal across the south, but well below normal across the North. Cold will spread through the country behind another storm over the weekend and into next week. That storm system could bring more widespread showers, including heavy snow potential. -DTN

NORTHERN PLAINS (WHEAT/LIVESTOCK/CORN/SOYBEANS): A significant winter storm is starting to spread moderate to heavy rain and snow across the region for this week. Montana and North Dakota will see the heaviest snows with totals in the 1-2 foot range. Strong winds will develop blizzard conditions that will impact livestock. There will be another system moving through this coming weekend that could bring more moderate to heavy snow. Cold temperatures that occur behind both systems going through next week are unfavorable for any fieldwork or planting. -DTN

CENTRAL/SOUTHERN PLAINS (CORN/SOYBEANS/LIVESTOCK/WINTER WHEAT): A large storm system will bring scattered showers to northern and eastern areas through Wednesday, including a round of severe weather over eastern areas Tuesday, but may completely miss southwestern hard red winter wheat areas. Strong winds could also cause some wind damage and fire hazards as well. Drought continues to be a major hindrance to winter wheat while also being unfavorable for corn and soybean planting. -DTN





MIDWEST (CORN/SOYBEANS/WINTER WHEAT): A large system will bring widespread showers, potential for severe storms, and heavy snow to the far northwest through Thursday. Strong winds are also expected with the system, which may include blizzard conditions where heavy snow occurs. More showers are possible this coming weekend as a mix of rain and snow through the region. Cold temperatures that occur behind both systems going through next week are unfavorable for any fieldwork or planting. -DTN

DELTA (SOYBEANS/COTTON): Scattered showers and thunderstorms will be possible in a few waves through Wednesday, including a couple more rounds of severe weather. Another system will move through this weekend into next week with more showers. Areas that need the rainfall in the south to get out of drought will see some favorable conditions, though it will make it more difficult for planting and early growth on crops. -DTN

PACIFIC NORTHWEST (WINTER WHEAT): Several waves of showers are expected through the weekend as a trough remains in the area. That should improve soil moisture for wheat, but cold temperatures will limit growth and could produce multiple days of hard freezes that could cause some damage to wheat and delay spring wheat planting. -DTN

BRAZIL (CORN): Scattered showers will slide northward through the country this week, settling into northern areas and out of much of the safrinha corn production by the weekend. Showers may be the last go of widespread nature for central Brazil as the region heads into the dry season about two weeks early. Declining soil moisture over the last few weeks is concerning for much of central Brazil. While showers will leave southern areas for about a week, they are likely to return before the end of the month but are unlikely to penetrate farther north. -DTN

ARGENTINA (CORN/SOYBEANS/WHEAT): Showers over the weekend were somewhat favorable in a few locations over the weekend. But dryness for the next week will not be favorable for the remaining filling corn and soybeans. Winter wheat planting see favorable conditions, though soil moisture is not ideal. -DTN

CANADIAN PRAIRIES (LIVESTOCK): Heavy snow and blizzard conditions are expected over eastern areas through Thursday, winding down on Friday. This will improve soil moisture but will take a long time to melt. Drought areas in the west could use more precipitation. Cold temperatures that have moved into the region will remain over the next two weeks, limiting fieldwork, snowmelt, and thoughts on early planting. -DTN

EUROPE (WINTER WHEAT/CORN): Scattered showers moved through much of the continent over the weekend, keeping soils watered for most of the area outside of parts of France, where showers are needed more for developing wheat. Some isolated showers will dot the continent over the next couple of weeks while some weaker systems move through. -DTN

BLACK SEA (WINTER WHEAT/CORN): Scattered showers moved back into Ukraine over the weekend and an upper level-low is forecast to remain in the area for much of the week, bringing periods of showers to the region. This should favor winter wheat but could limit fieldwork for corn. -DTN

NORTH AFRICA (WINTER WHEAT): Recent showers have improved soil moisture, but it may be too late for most of the crop. Showers will be in the area throughout the week as an upper-level low sits over the region .- DTN



Commentary: "Just 2% of the US crop was planted as of Sunday, but progress in MS is just 34%, vs. 54% on average. Planting in AR is just 16% complete, vs. 32% on average." -AgResource... Is it time to go into a full-blown panic, not yet, but if we walk back in after a three-day weekend next Monday and the Delta and SE US continue to be wet, while Central TX up into SW KS remains dry, it will be three alarm fire time! On top of all the weather in the south we have low soil temperatures in the WCB. Low soil temperatures with a massive snow field in the N. Plains.
